

IAAO Annual Conference

August 25-28 in Denver, CO

Another IAAO conference has successfully come and gone, and no Illinoisians are excited to be back to the Midwestern weather we were missing in beautiful Denver, Colorado, just a couple of weeks ago. The conference saw significant representation from Illinois assessment professionals, including attendees, volunteers, and presenters. Approximately 75 professionals from Illinois attended, out of a total of around 1,700 participants, making this the highest-attended conference since the event at Niagara Falls. Among the educational sessions, there were at least six presentations featuring research and insights from some of the state's leading assessment professionals.

A standout presentation featuring
Adrianne Bailey and Chesney
Leafblad was the workshop delivered
by the Women's Initiative Network
(WIN),

titled "Level Up: Five Powerful Moves to Elevate Your Career." This multi-part presentation addressed topics such as imposter syndrome, knowing when and why to speak up, improving public speaking skills, and more. It offered exceptional strategic advice for advancing one's career while also contributing to personal development.

Another notable presentation was delivered by Nicole Jardine and Scott Smith from Cook County, titled "Driving Legislative Change." Given the extensive parcel count in the area, Cook County benefits from resources that exceed the budget of many other offices. This presentation provided valuable insights into how a large office like Cook County effectively remains resourceful and organized while managing nearly 2 million parcels.

In addition to these highlights, many presentations at the conference received commendable reviews. Overall, it was a successful conference, and we look forward to seeing even more Illinois representation next year in sunny Orlando, Florida, from September 21-24. Mark your calendars now!
